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as a year of challenges, reorganizations, has allowed Audace Institut Afrique to expand its team and activities. Indeed, the institute has conducted a comprehensive research program on land ownership in rural area that will continue in the four years to come. The institute is at its first step in the field of research.

The **BI2M** concept (multidisciplinary and multicultural brainstorming) was strengthened throughout all the activities to make the proposals more relevant and contextualized.

AIA has strengthened its international network with new partners from India, South Africa, Uganda, United States and England; this enables **AIA** to draw inspiration from foreign experiences relevant to African reality.

Provide training remain a very important part of the institute's activities. One of the important objectives of a think tank is to raise awareness, especially in a situation where the government does not support education.

We therefore organize our programs according to the four categories listed below: **Research, training, raise awareness and influence.**

In 2014, **AIA** has managed to maintain the trust of its donors and even widened the circle of donors, allowing it to assert its independence, a trait to emphasize since the African civil society is highly politicized. After Burkina Faso in 2013, a new representation of the institute was created in Mali.

HOW TO REINVENT THE LAND OWNERSHIP REGIME IN COTE D'IVOIRE?

AIA introduced a research program on the theme the search for freedom: Private property in rural area.

The early stage of the multicultural and multidisciplinary program has allowed gathering ideas that will be use to make new proposals in order to improve the land safety bypassing the difficulty surrounding the legal framework that is out of step with the lvorian context.

The program was introduced through a competition of idea for the researchers only on the theme: **« How to reinvent the land ownership regime in Cote d'Ivoire? »**

25 researchers attended the program.

3 researchers were rewarded for their innovative and contextualized ideas.





AIA teamed -up with the Ivorian Center for Economic and Social Research for a win -win partnership.

The **CIRES** provides the institute with varied and contextualized research files that enable AIA to make better proposals and analysis.

AIA helps the **CIRES** promote its research works and trains its researchers on media training along with writing press articles. **20 CIRES researchers** were trained during the **3 days seminar** held on August.

AFRICA AND LIBERTY SEMINARS

AIA with the support of the **ATLAS** Economic Research Foundation, the Smith Family Foundation along with its partner Libre Afrique organized for the sixth consecutive year in Abidjan and Bamako two seminars on the theme: «Africa and Liberty»

ABIDJAN: 25 students

20 researchers from CIRES

BAMAKO: 35 students

These seminars provided an opportunity to show how freedom can solve the problem of poverty. African populations in general and Ivorian in particular have been living in an increasing poverty since the independence. They all expect remedies from the government while the government cannot do everything. It could be possible for the populations to get out of poverty with dignity, if they were given more freedom.

The 20 Ivorian researchers have also been trained in writing press articles and received personalized media training.



ECONOMIC FREEDOM FORUM WHAT ARE THE CONDITIONS FOR EMERGENCE?

The economic freedom forum was held in Cote d'Ivoire on Thursday 9th October 2014, organized in partnership with the Friedrich Nauman Foundation and the support of **ATLAS** Economic Research Foundation, the Fraser Institute and the Pan-African company Aris-Intelligence.

For the fourth consecutive year, this meeting had been the opportunity to present the index of economic freedom in Cote d'Ivoire made by the researchers of the Fraser Institute (Canada) for Audace Institut Afrique. Brainstorming sessions were conducted around these figures to identify the major issues that Cote d'Ivoire will be facing in its way to become an emerging country.

- **5.93/10** index of economic freedom in Cote d'Ivoire
- 134th /154 countries: world rankings of Cote d'Ivoire

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FROM IDEAS TO ACTIONS: THE CREATION OF THE CCPF

In an attempt to solve a major intellectual property crime problem in Africa which has great impact on public health and the economic development, **AIA** has enabled the creation of an anti-counterfeiting, piracy and fraud coalition.

- It enables grouped actions on the ground which protect companies from retaliation










COMPETITION CONTEST
